**ODE ITC EMIS training** – November virtual sessions are being held this week. Login to OH|ID and select “Training & Registration” to register for one of those remote sessions.

**FY21S Initial Student Enrollment (S) collections** – there are only 5 weeks left in the reporting windows for "S" initial student enrollment (SOES and TRAD) which are closing December 21. Make sure districts are looking at reports and resolving issues, especially Federal Child Count (FCC) since that data will be final at end of these collections.

**FY21 CTE FTE Dec #1 payment based on “live” data** – we are just two weeks away from the first data pull for CTE FTE payment based on current year data, for the December #1 payment. Preliminary data will be pulled either Wednesday, November 25 or Friday, November 27 (before or after Thanksgiving), and final data will be pulled on Monday, November 30. Encourage districts to get their Initial Staff & Course collections submitted before Thanksgiving break. ODE has been sending notices out to ITC's to let them know who has not submitted yet. Strongly encourage them to get that submitted and verify their Teacher Licensure Certification reports.

#### **Q&A**

**Q:** Is it safe to say if we (SPARCC) did not get an email from ODE, our districts are good?

**A:** We usually drop ITC's off the list if they are not needed. There are no SPARCC districts on the list, but just 10 other ITC's left with districts who have not reported "L" as of 8:30 today.

**Q:** Can you give those dates again?

**A:** Preliminary data pull will be the day before or after Thanksgiving (25th or 27th) and final data pull will be on Monday (30th)

**Q:** Who do we contact with questions about reporting 22+ diploma data?

**A:** I would look for 22+ Diploma on the ODE website. That is a separate system, not part of EMIS.

**Q:** If the Governor shuts things down again, are we going to go back to reporting Blizzard Bags?

**A:** Essentially, the Remote Education Plans that districts had an opportunity to apply for earlier this year should already account for that, as long as they follow their plan. If they did not do a plan, I don't know what their options would be. I'm sure there will be discussions, but the vast majority of districts did file a Remote Education Plan in case they had to close schools due to COVID-19. We haven't heard anything special or different, like that they *have* to shut down, that may or may not happen. That's why the Remote Education Plans were put into place to begin with.
